The University of California, Santa Barbara requests submission of qualifications from consulting firms to analyze potential environmental effects of the proposed 2007 Long Range Development Plan (LRDP) in compliance with the California Environmental Quality Act (CEQA). The University anticipates that the analysis would take the form of a program Environmental Impact Report (EIR).

The LRDP, which is being prepared in-house, addresses potential development on Main, Storke, West and North Campus through the year 2025 and will also serve as a functional equivalent of a Local Coastal Program. The LRDP will define the project for the LRDP EIR as required under CEQA. This Request for Qualifications (RFQ) is for environmental services to assess the impacts of that project.

Funding of the above project is contingent upon receipt of funding from a variety of sources. While it is anticipated that funding will be obtained, there is no assurance that funds will be received for the project noted. Selection of the consultant to perform these services will follow standard University procedures.

### **Instructions for Application**

Consultants with qualifications that include experience in the preparation of EIRs similar in scale and scope to the LRDP EIR are encouraged to respond.
