# ADVERTISEMENT FOR CM AT RISK CONTRACTOR PREQUALIFICATION

## (No Bids Are Being Accepted At This Time)

Subject to conditions prescribed by the University of California, Santa Barbara ("University"), responses to the University's Level 1 Prequalification Documents for a CM at Risk Contractor are sought from prospective bidders for the following University Project:

PROJECT NAME: Biology II 4th Floor Lab Renovation and HVAC Modernization

PROJECT NUMBER: FM140250P

#### PREQUALIFICATION OF PROSPECTIVE BIDDERS

The University has determined that bidders who submit bids on this project must be prequalified. Prequalified bidders will be required to pass the Level 1 Prequalification Evaluation (pass/fail), earn a minimum score under the Level 2 evaluation, and have the following California contractor's license:

**B – GENERAL BUILDING** 

#### **GENERAL DESCRIPTION OF WORK**

This project will require the services of a qualified CM/General Contractor to provide preconstruction services (e.g., estimating, constructability, bidding, etc.) and construction services (e.g., coordinate and manage awarded subcontracts) for the following two projects:

### Project 'A' (Biology II 4th Floor Renovation) will consist of the following:

**Research Laboratory.** Two lab areas will exist within the main laboratory suite; one on the north side (1,700 asf) and the other on the south side (2,300 asf). New utility services will be installed with fixtures for (air, gas, vac, dH2O, H2O), and electrical service will be extended from existing systems to the bench areas. Two 6' width fume hoods will be installed in each laboratory.

**Equipment or Specialty Rooms.** The research team will require a number of specialty and equipment rooms to conduct their research on Drosophila.

**Offices.** Two faculty member's offices will be situated on the east side of the 4<sup>th</sup> floor.

**Demolition.** The project will require selective demolition of the cabinetry, ductwork, electrical services, utility services (air, gas, vacuum), HVAC, and plumbing.

The estimated construction cost for Project A is \$3,700,000.

Project 'B' (HVAC Modernization) will update and improve the Biology II Building HVAC system. The building mechanical study overview has been completed, and the University recently issued a Request for Proposals to obtain architectural/engineering services associated with Project B. Project B will consist of:

Removing the existing supply booster fans and supply air filters on the third and fourth floors.

Replacing the existing rooftop exhaust fans on the east side of the building with two large exhaust fans (west side exhaust fans have already been replaced).

Installing variable frequency drives (VFDs) on the new rooftop exhaust fans.

Replacing the existing CAV mixing dampers with dual-duct VAV mixing boxes (third and fourth floor only).

Converting the existing CAV fume hoods to VAV operation (third and fourth floor only).

Installing zone control dampers and a ducted general exhaust system on floors one, two, and five.

Implementing supply air temperature reset control strategy.

Implementing static pressure reset control strategy.

The main hot and cold duct supply ducts are located in large vertical mechanical shafts on the north and south sides of the building. The exterior ductwork along with the fire dampers located at floors 1, 2 and 5 will be replaced including reconnection of floors 3 and 4.

The estimated construction cost for Project B is \$3,400,000.

Total estimated construction cost for Projects A and B is \$7,100,000.

#### PREQUALIFICATION SCHEDULE

Level 1 Prequalification Documents will be available online on the University Design and Construction Services website on February 6, 2014. Firms with qualifications that include experience in the construction of projects similar in scale, complexity and scope are encouraged to respond. Level 1 Prequalification Documents may not be accepted by the University from prospective bidders after 2:00PM. However, the University reserves the right to request, receive, and evaluate supplemental information after the above time and date at its sole discretion. The University reserves the right to reject any or all responses to Prequalification Documents and to waive non-material irregularities in any response received.

Interviews associated with the Level 2 evaluation, if deemed necessary by the University, and other prequalification evaluation activities will only be conducted with those prospective bidders that pass the Level 1 Prequalification Evaluation.

If a prospective bidder is determined by the University not to be prequalified, the prospective bidder may request a review by the University. Any such request must be received by the University within three (3) calendar days after receipt by the prospective bidder of the University determination. The decision resulting from such review is final and is not appealable within the University of California. Any person or entity not satisfied with the outcome of the prequalification must file a writ challenging the outcome within ten (10) calendar days from the date of the University's written notice regarding prequalification determination. Any assertion that the outcome of the prequalification process was improper will not be ground for a bid protest.

#### ANTICIPATED BIDDING SCHEDULE (FOR PREQUALIFIED BIDDERS ONLY)

The exact dates, times, and location for acceptance of bids will be set forth in an "Announcement to Prequalified Bidders" and the "Advertisement for Bids," but the anticipated and tentative bid schedule is as follows:

- 2. Mandatory Pre-bid Meeting April 8, 2014
- 3. Bids Received and Opened April 24, 2014

All insurance policies required to be obtained by Contractor shall be subject to approval by University for form and substance. The Certificate of Insurance shall be issued on the University's form.

All information submitted for prequalification evaluation will be considered official information acquired in confidence, and the University will maintain its confidentiality to the extent permitted by law. The work described in the contract is a public work subject to section 1771 of the California Labor Code.

All Bidders that have submitted a Prequalification Questionnaire will be notified in writing of whether or not they have successfully achieved Level 1 Prequalification status. Only those Bidders that have successfully achieved Level 1 Prequalification status will be permitted to participate in the Level 2 prequalification evaluation process. Only those Bidders that successfully achieve Level 2 Prequalification status by earning more than the predetermined minimum evaluation score will be eligible to submit a bid for this Project.

If the prospective Bidder is determined by the University to be "not prequalified", the prospective Bidder may request a review by the University. Any such request must be received by the University within 3 calendar days after the prospective Bidder's receipt by of the determination. The decision resulting from such review is final and is not appealable within the University of California. Any person or entity not satisfied with the outcome of the prequalification must file a writ challenging the outcome within 10 calendar days from the date of the University's written notice regarding prequalification determination. Any assertion that the outcome of the prequalification process was improper will not be a ground for a bid protest.

All information submitted for prequalification evaluation and marked as "confidential" will be considered official information acquired in confidence, and the University of California will maintain its confidentiality unless: (1) the University determines that it is required to release the information to a third party pursuant to the requirements of the California Public Records Act; or (2) the University is required by court order to release the information to a third party pursuant to the requirements of the California Public Records Act.

All other information submitted for Prequalification evaluation will be considered official information acquired in confidence, and the University will maintain its confidentiality to the extent permitted by law.
