PREQUALIFICATION OF PROSPECTIVE BIDDERS

The University has determined that bidders who submit proposals on this project must be prequalified.

Prequalified bidders will be required to have the following California contractor's license:

B – GENERAL BUILDING

GENERAL DESCRIPTION OF WORK

Project Scope will include the construction of a 62,000 GSF, 3-story building addition and the complete renovation and seismic upgrade of a 110,000 GSF, 2-story existing building. The project scope will also include seismic retrofit, minor renovation and fire and life safety upgrades in the occupied 100,000 GSF, 8-story tower section of the facility. Fire and life safety upgrades and minor renovation will also occur in the occupied 120,000 GSF, 4-story section of the facility. Hazardous material abatement is included in the project scope. Library operations are required to continue throughout the project.

It is anticipated that funding approval will be finalized in November 2012. Construction start is estimated to be March 2013. Estimated construction cost is in the range of \$53,000,000.

PREQUALIFICATION SCHEDULE

On <u>June 11, 2012</u> at <u>10:00AM</u>, Level 1 Prequalification Documents will be available online. Firms with qualifications that include experience in the construction of projects similar in scale and scope are encouraged to respond. Level 1 Prequalification Documents may not be accepted from bidders after 2:00PM. However, the University reserves the right to request, receive, and evaluate supplemental information after the above time and date at its sole discretion. The University reserves the right to reject any or all responses to Prequalification Questionnaires and to waive non-material irregularities in any response received.

Level 2 interviews will be conducted after review of the Level 1 Prequalification Documents for those prospective bidders that pass Level 1.

If a prospective Contractor is determined by the University not to be prequalified, the prospective Contractor may request a review by the Facility. Any such request must be received by the Facility within three (3) calendar days after receipt by the prospective Contractor of the determination. The decision resulting from such review is final and is not appealable within the University of California. Any person or entity not satisfied with the outcome of the prequalification must file a writ challenging the outcome within ten (10) calendar days from the date of the University's written notice regarding prequalification determination. Any assertion that the outcome of the prequalification process was improper will not be ground for a bid protest.

ANTICIPATED BIDDING SCHEDULE

ADDITIONAL INFORMATION

The methodology used to determine Best Value are described in the Bidding Documents. The lowest responsible bidder will be selected by the University on the basis of the Best Value to the University. The Best Value to the University will be determined using objective criteria described in the Bidding Documents with the resulting selection representing the best combination of price and qualifications.

Information submitted by bidders shall not be open to public inspection to the extent that the information is exempt from disclosure under the California Public Records Act (Chapter 3.5 (commencing with Section 6250) of Division 7 of the Title of the Government Code).

The work described in the contract is a public work subject to section 1771 of the California Labor Code.

GENERAL INFORMATION

I. CM/CONTRACTOR SERVICES

The contract will have two (2) phases. The awarded contract will be for Phase 1, but the University has a unilateral option to commence Phase 2 or not. If University elects to commence Phase 2, a Contract Amendment to the Phase 1 contract will be issued.

- **A. Preconstruction (Phase 1) Services** will include, but not limited to estimating, scheduling, value engineering, logistic studies, constructability and coordination reviews, prequalification of subcontractors, preparation of instructions to bidders, subcontractors bid solicitation by competitively bidding and recommendation on award on multiple trade packages to be issued in multiple stages.
- **B.** Construction (Phase 2) Services of the project shall include, but not be limited to scheduling, coordination of work, subcontractor management (subcontracts will be held by CM/Contractor), quality control, submittal, RFI, cost control, code compliance, safety, testing and commissioning, change order management and closeout.

II. BIDDING PROCEDURES FOR PREQUALIFIED CM/CONTRACTORS

When the Bidding Documents become available, lump sum bids submitted directly to the University will be received ONLY from prequalified CM/Contractors meeting or exceeding the Level 1 and Level 2 prequalification requirements. Only bidders who have been prequalified by the University shall be invited to participate in a Best Value bid for this project. Prequalified CM/Contractors will be issued a complete set of bidding documents. Bidders shall submit on a designated date a Lump Sum Base Bid representing all costs for CM/Contractor's Base Fee and General Conditions Work to construct this project as a CM/Contractor. General Conditions work will be specified in the Contract Documents.

Once the contract is awarded, the CM/Contractor will be authorized by the University to begin Phase 1 work of preconstruction services and will develop bid packages and if required, prequalify subcontractors. The CM/Contractor will competitively bid the various Bid Packages representing the construction work required to complete the Project. The CM/Contractor may elect to bid on, and self-perform, specific Bid Packages as listed in the bidding documents, if any. Phase 2 work shall be exercised only at University's sole option, and shall be for construction services. Phase 2 shall not be exercised until the University exercises Phase 2 option to CM/Contractor to proceed with construction services.

III. <u>INSURANCE & BONDING</u>

Bid Security will be in the amount of 10% of the Anticipated Contract Value and shall accompany each bid. The Surety(ies) issuing the Bid Bond, the Payment Bond and the Performance Bond shall at the time of the bid deadline be an admitted surety insurer as defined in the California Code of Civil Procedures Section 995.120. Note, Performance and Payment Bonds will not be required until (and if) the University exercises the option to proceed with Phase 2.

The University shall pay for, obtain and maintain a University Controlled Insurance Program ("UCIP") providing workers' compensation and employer's liability insurance coverage, commercial general liability insurance coverage, and excess liability insurance coverage, to persons and entities enrolled in the UCIP, for Work performed on or at the Project site.
